AWR 209 - Working with the Media: A Course for Rural First Responders

Course Description

This course is presented through a partnership with the National Disaster Preparedness Training Center. AWR 209 provides rural first responders with the skills needed to communicate with the public through the media. The course examines the roles of the media and rural first responders/public information officers. Participants learn how they fit into the joint information system.

Topics include but are not limited to:

- Utilizing the media in emergency and public awareness situations
- Working with the media at the scene of an emergency
- Anticipating what news agencies want from the responders at the scene of an emergency
- Giving interviews that work
- Writing effective news releases

Personnel involved in rural response such as: Emergency Managers, EMS, Fire Service, Law Enforcement, Governmental Administrative, Healthcare and Public Health.
