Active Threat Integrated Response Course

Course Description

This course is designed to improve integration between law enforcement, fire, and emergency medical services (EMS) in active shooter events. The course provides law enforcement officers with key medical skills based on tactical emergency casualty care (TECC) guidelines that can be used at the point of injury (POI) to increase survivability of victims. Participants will discuss rescue task forces (RTFs), basic hemorrhage control and airway management, and organization of a unified response. Additionally, participants will take part in discipline-specific practical exercises that review skills in either law enforcement tactics or medical response. All participants will engage in large-scale practical exercises that tests all concepts and skills introduced and practiced throughout the course.

Audience

Police officers, fire personnel (fire fighters), and EMS personnel working or volunteering for local, state, and tribal jurisdictions throughout the United States and U.S. territories. The course is designed to accommodate 25 law enforcement officers and 15 fire or EMS providers. Preferential seating will go to first responders serving in Boundary and Bonner Idaho counties.

Course Completion

A completed pre-test is required to take the post-test and receive class credit. Please bring a device to class that can access the online registration site, in order to complete the post-test and evaluation online.
