AUXCOMM/AUXC: AUXILIARY COMMUNICATIONS TRAINING

Course Description

This course focuses on auxiliary communications interoperability, the relationship between the COML and AUXCOMM/AUXC volunteers, emergency operations center (EOC) etiquette, on-the-air etiquette, Federal Communications Commission (FCC) rules and regulations, auxiliary communications training and planning, and emergency communications deployment. The course is intended to supplement and standardize a volunteer operator's experience and knowledge of emergency amateur radio communications in a public safety context.

Audience

This class is designed for amateur radio operators who volunteer to provide backup radio communications support to public safety agencies.

Prerequisites

To attend this course, applicants must meet all of the following prerequisites:

- ♦ Possess an active FCC amateur radio license
- ♦ Have experience in auxiliary communications
- Have an affiliation with a public safety agency
- ♦ Desire to work with COMLs in a NIMS ICS environment

- ♦ IS-100 Introduction to the Incident Command System
- ♦ IS-200 Basic Incident Command System
- ♦ IS-700 Introduction to the National Incident Management System
- ♦ IS-800 National Response Framework, An Introduction
