Upcoming 2024 Nonprofit Security Grant Program – Important Dates & Workshop

The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has officially released the 2024 <u>Nonprofit Security</u> <u>Grant Program</u> (NSGP) Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO). In an effort to support prospective applicants, the Idaho Office of Emergency Management (IOEM) has outlined critical dates and resources for those interested in securing funding to enhance their nonprofit organization's security measures.

- NSGP Bidders Workshop Webinar 9 a.m. MT, Wednesday, May 1, 2024
- Sub-application Deadline to IOEM 5 p.m. MT, Friday, May 24, 2024

Prospective sub-applicants are encouraged to visit <u>the IOEM website</u> for more information about the NSGP program, including resources to aid in the preparation of applications.

Required documents needed to apply:

- Organization's mission statement
- Vulnerability Assessment
- SAM.gov unique entity identification number (UE-ID)
- FEMA Investment Justification application form

To ensure clarity and support for potential applicants, IOEM is hosting an NSGP Bidders Workshop Webinar via Microsoft Teams on Wednesday, May 1, at 9 a.m. MT. This event will offer attendees the opportunity to walk through the grant application process and ask questions about the application, the necessary documentation, and eligibility requirements for the grant. The Webinar will be recorded and later uploaded onto the IOEM website for those who are unable to attend.

Eligibility and Funding Details:

Nonprofit organizations seeking to enhance their security measures must apply as sub-applicants through IOEM, the designated State Administrative Agency (SAA) for Idaho. Eligible organizations include those:

- Described under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and exempt from tax under section 501(a), including Houses of Worship, nonprofit medical facilities, and institutions of higher learning.
- 2. Demonstrating a high risk of terrorist or other extremist attack through their application.

Eligible nonprofit sub-applicants may request up to \$150,000 per site, with a maximum of \$450,000 available per organization across three sites. Organizations applying for multiple sites must submit a separate Investment Justification for each location.
