L0103: Planning: Emergency Operations

Course Description

This FEMA course is part of a Career Development Program in which participants learn an established set of emergency management competencies through a progressive training and education system that includes the entry-level National Emergency Management Basic Academy. The course content includes Emergency Management Planning doctrine and steps to take to accomplish writing plans and using them to deal with special events, which are common challenges for all jurisdictions.

Course Objectives

- Explain the relationships among preparedness, THIRA, and emergency operations planning.
- Identify the steps in the emergency planning process and their expected outcomes.
- Describe the purpose and components of an Emergency Operations Plan.
- Apply the emergency planning principles and process in evaluating an Emergency Operations Plan.

Audience

This course is intended for newly appointed emergency managers from federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial emergency management agencies and prospective professionals transferring from other disciplines to emergency management.
