# The National Emergency Management Basic Academy L0105: Public Information Basics

#### **Course Description**

This FEMA course is part of a Career Development Program in which participants learn an established set of emergency management competencies through a progressive training and education system that includes the entry-level National Emergency Management Basic Academy. This course will equip participants with the skills needed to be full or part-time PIOs, including oral and written communications; understanding and working with the media; and basic tools and techniques to perform effectively as a PIO, both in the proactive/ advocacy times and crisis/ emergency response.

#### **Course Objectives Include**

- Using the strategic communications planning model, develop a public awareness campaign (95%)
- Using the strategic communications planning model, develop an incident communications strategy (5%)
- Identify steps a PIO needs to take to prepare for and conduct a news interview

#### Audience

This course is intended for newly appointed emergency managers from federal, state, local, tribal, and territorial emergency management agencies and prospective professionals transferring from other disciplines to emergency management.
