Basic CISM is designed to present the core elements of a comprehensive and multi-component crisis intervention curriculum. This two-day course prepares participants to understand a wide range of crisis intervention services; on-scene support services; crisis intervention for individuals; demobilizations after large scale traumatic incidents; group defusings and critical incident stress debriefings; as well as crisis management briefings as used in school and business settings. This basic course prepared participants to provide several of these group crisis interventions, specifically demobilizations and crisis management briefings, defusings and debriefings. The need for follow up services is also addressed.

It provides an in-depth education on Critical Incident Stress Debriefings (CISD), and defusings. The basic CISM training is open to any person who wishes to know more about crisis intervention techniques. As a result of this training, participants will be able to:

- ◆ Define stress, CIS, and PTSD
- ◆ List the basic interventions of CISM
- ◆ Define and describe in detail the CISM group process of defusings, demobilizations, and debriefings.
- ◆ Conduct Critical Incident Stress Debriefings and Defusings.
- ◆ Describe the history, philosophy, purpose and protocols of CISM.
- ◆ Recognize the impact and dynamics of stress and crisis interventions.
- ◆ Assess when a CISM intervention is appropriate.
- ◆ Apply CISM concepts to a variety of settings.

Presenter Dr. Dan Casey is a Certified Traumatologist, a Licensed Master Social Worker, and a licensed Alcohol and Drug Counselor with JEC Counseling, Minnesota, USA. He is also a member of the American National Centre for Crisis Management and is an expert in trauma and school crisis response. Dan has been a member of the International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICIST) since its inception in 1987 and sits on the International Advisory Committee to ICISF. He received the MIKE FEDOCK award for "Unsung Heroes" from ICISF in 2009. For over 20 years, Dr. Casey's counseling services (JEC) have responded to, and provided interventions in, more than 1700 cases, including international disasters such as the Tsumani and domestic disasters; working hurricanes Andrew and Katrina, the Oklahoma City bombing, and 9/11.
