

Changes to 2013 Tier II Chemical Inventory Reporting

Newly Required Fields for the 2013 Tier II Chemical Inventories

- The latitude and longitude of the facility (in decimal format)
- An indication of whether the facility is manned or unmanned, and the corresponding maximum number of occupants
- The facility's Risk Management Program (RMP) Facility ID Number *if* subject to Chemical Accident Prevention under Section 112(r) of the Clean Air Act (CAA). More information can be found at: www.epa.gov/oem/docs/chem/caa112_rmp_factsheet.pdf
- The Toxics Release Inventory Facility Identification Number (TRIFID) *if* the facility is subject to TRI reporting under Section 313 of EPCRA. More information, including a screening tool to assist facilities with determining their reporting obligations, can be found at: <http://www2.epa.gov/toxics-release-inventory-tri-program>
- An indication of whether the facility is subject to the Emergency Planning provisions of EPCRA Section 302 and, if so, must identify the Facility Emergency Coordinator in the Contacts Section of the Tier II Report
- A Tier II Contact must be identified in the Contacts Section of the Tier II Form
- An email address must be included for each required contact

Facilities should note that the following information has been revised in the 2013 Report:

- Several new Weight Range Codes have been added for the Average/Maximum Daily Amounts, and should be reviewed carefully if facilities are copying information from the prior year's Report
- Chemical Storage Container Types no longer have associated code letters, and should be reviewed carefully if copying information from the prior year's Report
