Comments

Expect snowfall today through tomorrow afternoon. Winter Storm Warnings and Winter Weather Advisories are in effect for much of the area due to forecasted snowfall. Roads may become snow covered and pose a danger to drivers on this busy travel weekend. Stay alert to rapidly changing conditions and check road conditions and closures before heading out.

East Idaho could see significantly lower amounts of snow through Christmas Eve as warm air pushes into the region on south winds. These winds could keep precipitation weaker or non-existent along the interstate corridors, and possibly even mix rain and snow for a time Christmas Eve afternoon. A cold front will push through late Christmas Eve. Additional snow amounts are forecast through Christmas night. Roads will be messy to difficult. Expect travel delays. Drive cautiously, and carry an emergency kit in your vehicle.

Air Quality Alert for N Idaho: Members of sensitive groups may experience health effects. The general public is not likely to be affected.

The next period of snow is expected during the day Tuesday, when widespread valley snow will again be possible.


