Crisis Management for School-Based Incidents: Partnering Rural Law Enforcement, First Responders, and Local School Systems (Virtual)

Course Description

This course presented through a partnership with the Rural Domestic Preparedness Consortium.

This DHS/FEMA-certified course is designed to educate rural law enforcement personnel as well as school administrators and staff on the elements that would allow for an effective response to school-based emergencies. Schools in small, rural, and remote areas across the country account for almost 23 percent of the total student population (more than 11 million students). Rural schools, law enforcement, and other emergency responders are often limited in resources. It is imperative that all potentially affected parties collaborate on planning, preparing, communicating, responding, and recovering from a school-based incident.
