Discussion and Vote on Adopting IDAPA 15.06.01 as Temporary Rule

Mr. Craig Logan brought an issue before the Commission from the current legislative cycle from the Department of Financial Management of whether new rules will be adopted this session. IDAPA 15.06.01 can be adopted as a temporary rule if the new rules don't pass.

Mr. Logan quoted the rule:

“In compliance with Sections 67-5226, Idaho Code, notice is hereby given this agency has adopted a temporary rule. The action is authorized pursuant to Section 31-4816(18), Idaho Code.

DESCRIPTIVE SUMMARY: The following is the required finding and concise statement of its supporting reasons for adopting a temporary rule:

This temporary rule adopts the following chapter under IDAPA15.06.01, Rules Governing the Idaho Public Safety Communications Commission

TEMPORARY RULE JUSTIFICATION: Pursuant to Section(s) 67-5226(1) and 67-5226(2), Idaho Code, the Governor has found that temporary adoption of the rule is appropriate for the following reasons:

These temporary rules are necessary to protect the public health, safety, and welfare of the citizens of Idaho and confer a benefit on its citizens. These temporary rules implement the duly enacted laws of the state of Idaho, provide citizens with the detailed rules and standards for complying with those laws, and assist in the orderly execution and enforcement of those laws. The expiration of these rules without due consideration and processes would undermine the public health, safety and welfare of the citizens of Idaho and deprive them of the benefit intended by these rules.”

Chair Nancolas asked for a motion to adopt the temporary rule.

MOTION: Commissioner Greenberg moved, Commissioner Gates seconded, that the Commission adopt IDAPA 15.06.01 as a temporary rule. The motion passed.
