## Incident Overview

IDEOC Sitreps are published weekly on Wednesdays.

- The IDEOC activated on 3/3/2020 for ID-01-2020 Coronavirus.
- The Governor issued a state declaration and the President declared a national emergency for COVID-19 on 3/13/2020.
- Four tribes and 25 counties are under current emergency orders or declarations for COVID-19. Three counties have active emergency declarations for the 3/31/20 Challis Earthquake.
- The Governor amended the COVID-19 Emergency Declaration Stay-at-Home order (3/25/20) extending it through 04/30/2020.
- On 04/24/2020, Governor Little announced a data-driven, four stage approach to opening up Idaho's economy.
- Idaho began Stage 1 of Idaho Rebounds on 5/1/20, Stage 2 on 5/16/20, Stage 3 on 5/30/20, and Stage 4 on 6/13. Ada County returned to Stage 3 on 6/24/20.
- The following Idaho jurisdictions have mask ordinances/mandates in place: Ada County (7/14), Blaine County (7/6), Bonneville County (7/21), *Custer County (9/3)*, Jefferson County (8/10), Kootenai County (7/23), Teton County (7/16), Valley County (8/11), Bellevue (7/16), Boise (7/4), Driggs (7/3), Hailey (7/1), Ketchum (7/7), McCall (7/1), Moscow (7/2), Victor (6/8), and Wallace (7/24). - *Idaho reports a total of 33,981 COVID-19 cases and 389 deaths.* Community spread has been detected in 42 counties.

### In the past week

- IDEOC continued to work requesting supplies, such as PPE, for local jurisdictions and public health districts and planning for potential surges in healthcare facilities.
- *Clearwater County declared a disaster on 9/7/20 due to two fires: the Clover Fire and the MM 49 Fire.*

### In the next week

- The IDEOC will continue processing requests for assistance and ensuring delivery of supplies when necessary.
- The IDEOC will continue to monitor weather patterns and the potential for wildfire, providing support and assistance where needed. *A cold front is expected to arrive by Monday or Tuesday bringing an increase in winds and a chance of precipitation.*
- *Governor Brad Little announced 9/3/20 that Idaho will remain in Stage 4 of the Idaho Rebounds plan for another two weeks while emphasizing the need for Idahoans to get flu shots to protect themselves and their families and lighten the burden on Idaho's healthcare system.*

	YW	<i>Clearwater County</i>	<i>Clearwater County declared a disaster on 9/7/20 due to two fires: the Clover Fire and MM 49 Fire. As of 9/8/2020 at 1600, 13 homes, 31 out buildings, 26 vehicles, and 1 patrol car are lost, and 132 persons have been evacuated. The Clover Fire is at 1600 acres and MM 49 Fire is at 900 acres.</i>

### Weather Outlook

*Clear weather is expected across the state of Idaho for the next several days. Winds will be light with no significant impacts expected for outdoor COVID-19 operations through the upcoming weekend. However, a wind shift to a more westerly direction could bring wildfire smoke back to much of the state by Saturday or Sunday if*

*forest fires continue to burn in California, Oregon, and Washington forests. A warming trend will begin today with temperatures warming to near normal by Thursday and Friday and then to about 10 degrees above normal on Saturday and Sunday. No precipitation is expected anywhere in the state through Sunday, September 13th. A new cold front is expected to arrive by Monday, September 14th or Tuesday, September 15th which will likely bring an increase in winds and a chance of precipitation. The long-range outlook issued by the NWS Climate Prediction Center for 8 to 14 days into the future shows warmer and drier than normal conditions are likely across the state of Idaho.*
