Incident Overview

IDEOC Sitreps are published weekly on Wednesdays.

- The IDEOC activated on 3/3/2020 for ID-01-2020 Coronavirus at level 2.
- The Governor issued a state declaration and the President declared a national emergency for COVID-19 on 3/13/2020.
- Four tribes and *22 counties* are under current emergency orders or declarations for COVID-19. *One county* has an active emergency declaration for the 3/31/20 Challis Earthquake. Four counties have emergency declarations for wildland fires.
- Idaho went to a modified Stage 2 of Idaho Rebounds on 10/26.
- The following Idaho jurisdictions have mask ordinances/mandates in place: Panhandle Health District 1 – Benewah, Bonner, Boundary, Kootenai, Shoshone (11/19), Ada County (7/14), Blaine County (7/6), Bonneville County (7/21), Custer (10/1), Fremont County (9/14), Jefferson County (8/10), Lemhi (10/1), Madison County (9/14), Teton (8/1, 10/1), Valley County (8/11), Bellevue (7/16), Boise (7/4), Coeur d’Alene (10/26), Driggs (7/3), Hailey (7/1), Ketchum (7/7), Lewiston (11/20), Moscow (7/2), Pocatello (11/21), Victor (6/8), Wallace (7/24), Fort Hall Reservation (12/4). - *Idaho reports a total of 151,273 COVID-19 cases and 1,556 deaths; 38,891 vaccines doses have been administered.*

In the past week

- IDEOC continued to work requesting supplies, such as PPE, for local jurisdictions and public health districts are planning for potential surges in healthcare facilities and vaccine distribution.
- The IDEOC coordinated with IDHW and health care facilities to manage surge capacity and vaccination operations as Phase One proceeded.

In the next week

- The IDEOC will continue processing requests for assistance and ensuring delivery of supplies when necessary and assist with coordinating National Guard mission assignments. The IDEOC continues coordinating with IDHW and healthcare facilities to manage surge capacity and the distribution of vaccines as Phase One of the vaccinations proceeds.

	YW	Hospital Capacity and Risk Category	IDHW continues to monitor hospitalization rates and evaluate the need to implement crisis standards of care. Over 60% of hospitals in Idaho are under some level of stress due to the volume of COVID-19 patients and health care workers ill with COVID-19. Individuals are asked to continue to wear a mask in public, stay 6 feet apart from others, wash your hands often and avoid touching your face or mask.

Weather Outlook

Gusty winds will accompany valley rain and mountain snow today (1/13). Precipitation will taper off from northwest to southeast across the state with the passage of a cold front. A high pressure ridge accompanied by dry weather will build into the state through Thursday night (1/14). A weak disturbance will bring a chance of snow showers on Friday (1/15), followed by another disturbance and a chance of snow on Sunday (1/17). The focus of precipitation with these systems will be across central and northern Idaho. Early next week will see a return to dry weather. Temperatures will remain seasonable through the period.

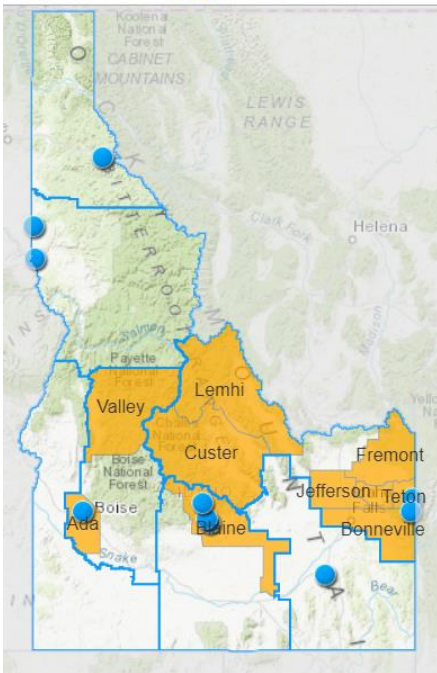

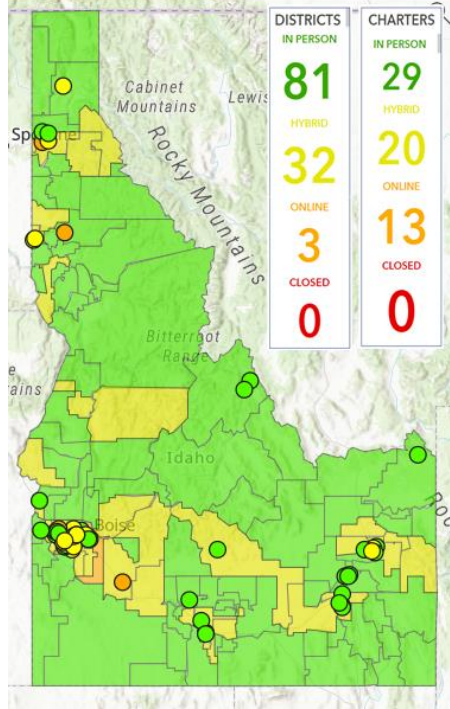
