Incident Overview

IDEOC Sitreps are published weekly on Wednesdays.

- The IDEOC activated on 3/3/2020 for ID-01-2020 Coronavirus at level 2.
- The Governor issued a state declaration and the President declared a national emergency for COVID-19 on 3/13/2020.
- Four tribes and 21 counties are under current emergency orders or declarations for COVID-19. Bonner, Boundary, Kootenai and Shoshone counties declared emergencies for windstorm that occurred on 1/13/21. The State of Idaho declared a state of disaster emergency for the windstorm on 2/11/21.
- Idaho returned to Stage 3 of Idaho Rebounds on 2/2/21. View Stage 3 Healthy Guidelines [here](#).
- The following Idaho jurisdictions have mask ordinances/mandates in place: Blaine County; Teton County; Bellevue; Boise; Driggs; Hailey; Kellogg; Ketchum; Moscow; Pocatello; Victor; Wallace; Fort Hall Reservation.
- *Idaho reports a total of 185,465 COVID-19 cases and 2,022 deaths; 963,235 vaccine doses have been administered.*

In the past week

- IDEOC continued to work requesting supplies, such as PPE, for local jurisdictions and public health districts are planning for potential surges in healthcare facilities and vaccine distribution.
- The IDEOC coordinated with IDHW and health care facilities to manage vaccination operations as Phase One and Phase Two proceed.
- The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) issued recommendations on activities that people who are fully vaccinated against COVID-19 can safely resume.

In the next week


- The IDEOC will continue processing requests for assistance and ensuring delivery of supplies when necessary and assist with coordinating National Guard mission assignments.
- The IDEOC will continue coordinating with IDHW and healthcare facilities to manage distribution of vaccines as Phase One and Phase Two proceed.
- The IDEOC will continue to maintain clear and consistent communications with the Governor's office, state agencies, local health districts, local jurisdictions, and providers as they pertain to the COVID-19 response.
- The IDEOC will continue to support IDHW with COVID-19 mass vaccination campaign and PPE distribution.
- The IDEOC will continue to process requests and deliver donated PPE to schools for the coming year, as well as sheriff offices, prisons, Non-governmental organizations, Private non-profits, and Volunteer Organizations Active in Disasters.

	 Agriculture	GR	<i>COVID-19 Pandemic assistance</i> <i>The USDA announced on 4/13 the availability of more than \$330 million to help agricultural producers and organizations in the food supply chain recover from the financial impacts of the COVID-19. This funding will aid in developing new markets for U.S. agricultural products, expand the specialty crop food sector, and incentivize the purchase of fruits and vegetables by low-income consumers. 	GR	Hospital Capacity and Risk Category	IDHW continues to monitor hospitalization rates and evaluate the need to implement crisis standards of care. 23.4% of hospitals in Idaho continue under some level of stress due to COVID-19, a drop from 27.7% last week.
	GR	<i>COVID-19 Testing</i>	<i>The COVID-19 positivity rate is at 4.8% for the week of 4/10. The rate decreased from the previous week.</i>
	YW	<i>COVID-19 Vaccination</i>	<p><i>Idaho has administered 73.1% of their COVID-19 vaccine allocation; 80% of the state's 65+ population have received at least one dose of the vaccine.</i></p> <p><i>Anyone 16 years or older who lives or works in Idaho is now eligible for the vaccine. Sign up here to add your name to a COVID-19 vaccine list.</i></p> <p>The Idaho Department of Health and Welfare is recommending that Idaho vaccine providers not use the Johnson & Johnson vaccine until more information is available from CDC. This recommendation was made after receiving information that the CDC and the FDA are reviewing data for six reported cases of a rare and severe type of blood clot in individuals who have received the Johnson & Johnson vaccine. None in Idaho.</p>
	GR	National Guard	The Idaho National Guard continues to support COVID-19 operations around the state. The IDNG continues to assist with contact tracing, COVID-19 screening, testing, and vaccination operations at public health and healthcare facilities around the state.

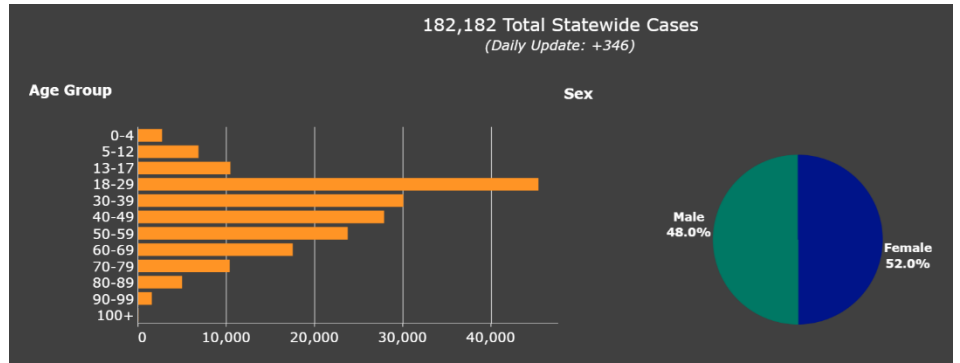
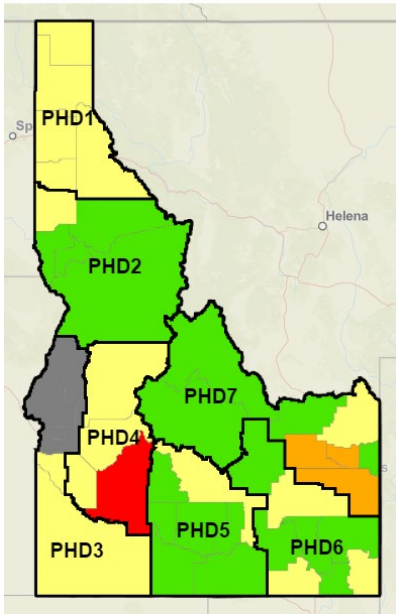

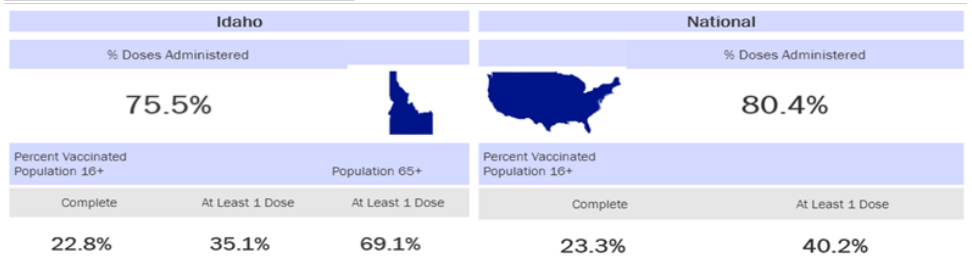

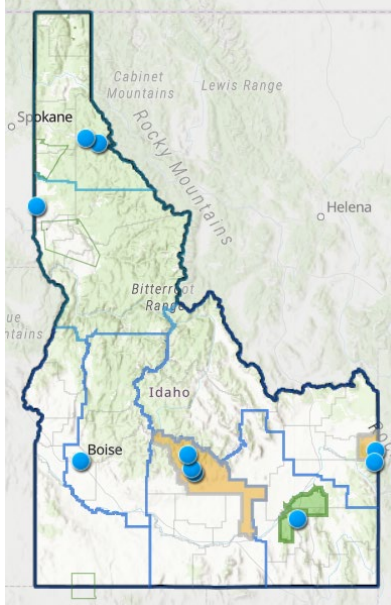
Idaho COVID-19 Transmission Risk Levels
